ORIGIN Cambridge, N.Y., c. 1820.

ORIGINAL USE Whether freestanding or built-in, corner cupboards reflected the architectural details of the house. They offered convenient storage as well as a place to display prized objects like imported china.

DETAILS This 8'H Chippendale corner cupboard was built into the dining room of an early-19th-century home. The corner cupboard's original paint, glazed door, and dentiled cornice add to its value.
